4X4 BIBLE STUDY: "MENTORING"

Text: **TITUS**

The design of a **4X4 Bible STUDY** is for **four** guys (or **four** gals or two couples) to get together for an hour during the week, for **four** different weeks (sessions) in order to study **four** different passages from the **WORD of GOD**. Each participant is expected to come to the study each week ready to provide **four** answers to each of the **four** questions posted for each of the **four** sessions. Spend some time preparing on your own and then enjoy your time of sharing with one another at the appointed hour. *"As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another."* — **PROVERBS 27:17**

SESSION #1: TITUS 1:1-4

- From this passage, what do we learn about the Apostle Paul? Titus? The LORD?
- What does Paul obviously want for the one he is mentoring?
- What role does the WORD of GOD play in this passage?
- List four prayer statements prompted by this passage that would be great to pray for each other or for those we are mentoring?

***BONUS:** *What was brought to "light" in your heart as we studied this passage?*

SESSION #2: TITUS 1:5-9

- Where do Kingdom leaders come from?
- What does this passage say we need to be doing with the WORD of GOD?
- Why does character matter so much?
- As a Christian man, you have been entrusted with the Work of GOD. Your response?

***BONUS:** *Why does Paul's list of qualities focus on "being" rather than on "doing"?*

SESSION #3: TITUS 2:1-10

- How is mentoring so obvious in this passage and why is it so important to the Apostle Paul?
- What reasons does Paul give as to why character is so important?
- What conflicts does this passage imply that Christians will face?
- What does Paul imply that the GRACE of GOD will empower?

***BONUS:** *What inspires you the most from this passage?*

SESSION #4: TITUS 3:1-11

- What is the good news in this passage?
- What do you consider to be the greatest character traits mentioned here?
- What can be learned about salvation from this passage?
- Why is it so important to remember our past?

***BONUS:** *Which "reminder" in this passage did you need to hear?*
